GERMAN NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY APPROVED

Linton High School's German Club charter application to become a member of the German National Honor Society was approved April 13, 2018. 24 German students have met the criteria to be eligible for induction by achieving a minimum of 3.6 GPA in the area of German for 2 years and an overall minimum GPA of 3.0

Students, who choose to be inducted, may wear the Delta Epsilon Phi emblem, as well as the graduation cord. All inductees will be listed on the national registry for Delta Epsilon Phi, the Greek chapter representing the Germany National Honor Society, and could be eligible for the Käthe Wilson Scholarship, which promotes overseas studies.

The National organization was founded in 1968 by Käthe Wilson at Coral Gables High School (FL), a devoted AATG member, to reward scholastic achievement in the study of German and to promote interest in the study of German language, literature, and civilization.

The German National Honor Society is not an honor society based solely on grade point average, but consists of students committed to promoting friendship and understanding between our country and other countries of the world.

This is a huge savings, so don't pass up this wonderful opportunity!!!!!!

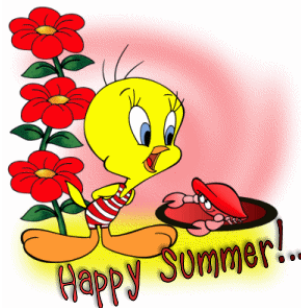
SUMMER SCHOOL
