PROFESSIONAL CAREER INTERNSHIP

Linton-Stockton High School offers an Internship program that is designed for senior students who want to explore specific, targeted career objectives through workplace experience. Students attend class on Monday and gain experience at their worksites Tuesday through Friday two hours per day. This month we have two students selected as "Employee of the Month" and a short biography for each follows:

Jaeni Lundy

"Hello! My name is Jaeni Lundy. I am a senior here at Linton Stockton and I am 18 years old. I like to play video games, read, and do things outdoors. Since 1994, Wendy's and the Heisman Trophy Trust have been running the same play to perfection: honoring more than 600,000 of the nation's most esteemed students. **Congratulations Hannah. SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

There are several scholarship applications currently available.

1) **The Hagan Scholarship** – The purpose of the Hagan Scholarship is to provide each recipient with the opportunity to obtain a four-year college education and graduate debt free. The applicant must authenticate financial need in order to attend college. Scholarship recipients are selected based upon character, academic ability achievement in and out of school and future promise. The Scholarship Application can be accessed from the following website: www.hsfmo.org. This application has a November 15, 2018, deadline, (NO EXCEPTIONS).

2) **The Linton ELK's Lodge** is once again offering a onetime \$1,000 Most Valuable Student Scholarship. The application process has changed and is available online at www.enf.elks.org/mvs and must be submitted online on or before November 15, 2018.

The 2019 Legacy Award Scholarships are open to children and grandchildren of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2015 and must be a high school senior who takes the SAT or ACT by December 31, 2018. Applications are available online only. Questions, however, may be directed to Mr. Tim Wright, Scholarship Chairman, Linton Elk's Lodge #866 during regular business hours at 812-875-2031.

3) **Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship** – The 2019-2020 application will be available in [Scholar Track](#) beginning **Sept. 1, 2018** and will close on **Nov. 30, 2018**. The scholarship provides 200 high-achieving high school and college students interested in pursuing a career in education the opportunity to earn a renewable scholarship of up to \$7,500 each year for four academic years.

4) **Indiana State University and the ISU Foundation** offer a variety of scholarships to help make the college experience possible to deserving students. Deadlines vary, however, to receive 1st consideration for many scholarships, students must be admitted to ISU by Dec. 1st for the 2019 fall semester. Go to indstate.edu/scholarships.

5) **National Wild Turkey Federation's Dr. James Earl Kenamer Academic Scholarship** – Awards range from \$250 to \$10,000. Must be a senior with a GPA of 3.0 or better and actively participate in hunting activities. Deadline is January 1, 2019, to a local NWTf chapter. Go to www.nwtf.org for additional information.

6) **Vincennes University Scholarship Apps** – **deadline January 15, 2019.**

Vincennes University and the Vincennes University Foundation award more than \$1 million in scholarship each year. While the VU Foundation has a priority deadline for some scholarships of **January 15** each year, it is never too late to apply. VU and the VU Foundation continue to award scholarships on a rolling basis. Visit vinu.edu, find the Financial Aid tab and use the drop-down arrow to see Scholarships.

7) **VFW Auxiliary Continuing Education Scholarship** – To apply for this scholarship, the applicant must be a member, spouse, son or daughter. Complete the application and mail or email to the VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters. Application deadline in Feb. 15, 2019.

8) **“B. Davis Scholarship”** The creators of the **“Student Award Search Aid”** website are offering a scholarship for 2019. Visit the website at <http://www.studentawardsearch.com/scholarships.htm> to read the information and apply for the scholarship. While you’re there, please browse through the rest of the site to learn more about applying for scholarships. This website was developed solely for the purpose of helping students locate and apply for scholarships.

9) **Raise.me-Get Scholarships From Colleges Today** – Go to <https://www.raise.me/> or just type raise.me scholarships in the search line. This site gives you some great information on how to raise money for college.

** Also, check out the following website: ScholarshipOwl.com or StudentScholarships.org . These sites have a tremendous amount of scholarship information and applications. Additional scholarship information will be announced throughout the school year. Make sure to stop by the guidance office periodically to check out the scholarships available.

Although applying for scholarships is time consuming and wearisome, it can be quite rewarding when you end up reaping the benefits for your efforts. There are thousands of scholarships out there for high school seniors, all with different eligibility requirements, deadlines, and award amounts. Do your own research and do not expect money to drop into your lap. Complete as many applications as you can and hope for the best!!!!
